Leonie Lake Dam Decommissioning Process – Staff are looking at a possible 'breach' option rather than a full on decommissioning and are working with the Province on what options are the least expensive for the municipality. It was inquired as to if the goal is to offload the costs to the users rather than the municipality so that the TNRD farmers and user groups still maintain access and use and staff reiterated that that is an option that is being explored.
