Council was reminded that the District and Barriere Minor Ball currently have a signed agreement in place regarding the waiving of fees in lieu of field maintenance being conducted by the Association. Due to a number of factors, staff recommended holding

off on this decision until a staff report outlining the various options, is brought back to Council for consideration at the next Council Meeting. Mr. Kershaw agreed to meet with staff prior to the next meeting to discuss next steps and various options.

a. <u>Tenure over Crown Land</u> – T. Buchanan, Corporate Officer

The Fire Chief provided an overview of the written report. She noted that the Playbook is now called the "*BC Minimum Standards for Fire Fighters*" and 1001 Certification is minimum. Barriere Fire members are currently in the process of achieving this accreditation.

Chief Wohlgemuth noted a correction on the report: 2023 Motor Vehicle incidents should read 0. It was suggested that the CVSE presence is helping in this regard.

The CAO reported that the TNRD has received a grant for Emergency Services and are in the process of hiring a Fire Smart Coordinator position for the region. This new coordinator will help Barriere, along with Area 'O', identify various areas.

d. <u>CAO Update</u> – B. Payette, CAO \*Submitted for information

The CAO provided an overview of the written report and noted that ETSI has been successful in receiving a 10 million dollar grant last week!

Chelsea Young, Finance Officer – left the meeting at 7:30pm

The Mayor offered congratulations to Bob Payette for his 15 years service pin award from the CMMA.

An update was requested regarding the District's Noxious Weed plan for this year and it was noted to staff that Area "O" Director, Jill Hayward, is Chair of the TNRD Noxious Weed Committee. Staff will reach out to Director Hayward and report back.

- Presented an idea for a Swap/Drop off to the organizers of the Flea Market.

#### 10. PUBLIC INQUIRIES

a. <u>Al Fortin (of Barriere)</u> – Photos show the vast amount of litter recently collected from the Overlander pull-out south of Exlou (in TNRD jurisdiction). "*This is the sort of thing that happens when truckers have nowhere to park and access washroom facilities. Will Council have a discussion on how to solve this issue?*"



It was answered that this sort of thing is a shame as there are a number of washroom opportunities along that stretch of highway and the amount of biohazardous material collected is outrageous. Council will mention this issue at this year's SILGA Convention.
