i. <u>Letter to Minister Adrian Dix from Debbie Stamer and Heather Eustache re: Ambulance Response in Barriere</u>

Debbie Stamer reported that due to the recent change of the BCEHS, it has resulted in last 9 shifts she's had, she's been directed to work from Kamloops, leaving Barriere with no ambulance coverage during those shifts. BCEHS also repeatedly denies requests from the Barriere Ambulance Station for a satellite phone which members feel is a safety issue. In March, also due to the changes outlined in the correspondence, the Barriere RCMP had to transfer a drug overdose patient to RIH which then results in less police coverage in the area.

That Council send a letter to the Minister of Health outlining the severe impacts Barriere and other rural communities are facing due to BCEHS' decision to require to have their Primary Care Paramedic (PCP) when, in the past, the local EMR's qualified for full-time positions.
