- a. Councillor Fortin provided a verbal report on the following:
 - Attended the 2022 UBCM Convention. One of the biggest take-a-ways he
 observed at the convention is the amount of downloading that will be put onto local
 governments from the various Ministries which he found frustrating and daunting.

This is particularly apparent with regard to wildfire mitigation and drug use legislation changes.

 - Attended a bike rally in Vernon which he felt may be something Barriere may want to take on at some point in the future.
- c. Councillor Kerslake provided a verbal report on the following:
 - Attended the 2022 UBCM Convention in which he attended a study session regarding Housing Solutions in which some startling facts were learned:
 - Out of 14,000 applications for affordable housing projects, only 2,000 have been approved so far. Canada is far behind the rest of the world in application processes in this regard.
 - Canada needs to add 26% to the work force and it was recommended that Canada and Provinces recognize foreign credentials or streamline the process for such approvals.

 - Attended the Terry Fox run event which had a great turn-out again this year.
 - Will be volunteering for this year's Raise-a-Reader fundraiser.
- e. Councillor Sabyan provided a verbal report on the following:
 - Has been busy answering various community questions regarding the upcoming election.
